Preface

The North Lakhimpur College, established in 1952, is the first institution of higher learning in the northeastern bank of the Brahmaputra. This geographically isolated region is economically and educationally backward due to frequent flood and devastating earthquake of 1950. On the other hand, this region, inhabited by various ethnic groups, is full of natural resources with rich stock of biodiversity. For proper utilization of both natural and human resources the need of an institution of higher learning was thought of. The college was a fruit of the efforts and untiring zeal of a core group of far sighted persons in particular and the people of the vast region in general with the following goals and objectives in mind.

1. To impart higher education to the students of this backward region, so that economic backwardness or lack of communication could not retard the academic development of the region.
2. For socio cultural development of various ethnic groups of the region.
3. To create scientific temperament.
4. To provide employment avenue.
5. To promote gender equality.

The goals and objective are stated in the college bylaw. Academic upliftment and necessary competence to the growing generation enabling them to avail employment opportunity so that they can keep pace with the complex developments around them, extension of woman education etc are the major considerations addressed by the goals and objectives. The onus of the college is to throw light of modern education and to help developing human resources. However, its objective is not only to impart quality education to the youth, which would enable them to step forward, compete and withstand the rigours of time but also to keep open all the windows for noble thoughts to enlighten the institute. It wants to ensure all round academic and intellectual development of the students by giving them the concept of purity of knowledge.

North Lakhimpur College is, therefore, built around the principle of benevolence providing the students and teachers as many ingredients of perfection as possible within its limitations. The college had a modest beginning but it has been attaining maturity through steady progress in the last five decades by adding new elements and expanding itself in the possible spheres. However, the college is affiliated

to Dibrugarh University and runs under the provincialisation system of the Govt. of Assam. Its activities are subjected to and regulated by the norms and rules of the Dibrugarh University and the Govt. of Assam. The progress and programmes of the college, therefore, depend more or less on them leaving a very limited scope for the college to act within its parameter. However, it plays the major role in revising the course contents in indirect manner through its teachers, who are associated with revising the syllabus of the university. In spite of such constraints the college stands out with its own characteristic features. North Lakhimpur College stresses on the need to accommodate itself with the basic facilities and proper infrastructure to create a congenial academic atmosphere. It is situated in a spacious and pollution free campus having various teaching departments, administrative building, hostels, well equipped and furnished laboratories, canteen, auditorium, playground etc. within it. The facilities of library and book bank, scholarship, pure drinking water, career guidance cell, health care and other support services are also offered to the students. The college offers major courses almost in all customary subjects in the Arts and Science streams and all together it has nineteen departments. The College also offers BCA course under Dibrugarh University. It is served by a bunch of selfless, dedicated and meritorious teaching staff, which includes as many as 20 Ph.D. and 13 M.Phil holders. The fruit of the quality teaching is often manifested by brilliant result of the students in various university examinations. Presently the college accommodates over one thousand students in the under graduate courses and it receives inter state students also. The College has a transparent mechanism for admission to different courses. The college admits students on the basis of academic records. Distribution of contents to be taught by the teachers is done through a process of consultation by the Head of the Department. Teachers take the responsibility of completing the course by taking additional workload or by taking classes on holidays. Teachers take remedial courses along with the regular teaching. Remedial programmes are in built in the regular teaching. The college encourages the meritorious students to participate in advanced learning. The college awards prizes to students showing outstanding progress. Regular teaching is supplemented by field studies, case studies, project works, seminars, popular lectures and group discussions. Some of the departments have got the audio-visual facilities, charts, models, maps etc for teaching purposes. It has total working days of 254 and total teaching days of 214 in a year. The college has got Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) which has initiated the process of academic audit. A combination of teacher supervised and teacher independent learning activities at individual and group levels are integrated into the system learning such that students

are optimally involved in assessment of their own progress through faculty and peer feedback. Academic development of the students are checked and monitored through terminal examinations. Apart from this, regular assessment is made by unit tests, seminars, tutorial assignments, oral tests, group discussions etc. Monitoring and mid-course corrections are designed to achieve the objective of the syllabi, which need to be completed as per the schedule of the examination as well as the academic calendar. The learning is made student-centered by participatory learning activities through laboratory work, computer aided learning programmes, audio visual aids, project and field works, training programmes and study tours. To further the usages of information technology among students, the College has established one state of the art Computer and Networking Centre with 30 internet browsing terminals, installed VPN for education in addition to the existing EDUSAT besides encouraging the use of ICT tools in the teaching learning process. At North Lakhimpur College, the tools employed in assessment procedures have been carefully designed to provide an important opportunity to both tutors and tutee to address the simultaneous development of the triumvirate of Learning-Knowledge, Application and Attitude.

The contribution of the college is not merely confined in academics. Its presence is marked in the fields of art, literature, music, drama, games and sports etc. A number of its present and former teachers and students have earned fame for their notable achievements in their fields. In order to ensure facilitation of extra and co-curricular activities departmental fora and organizations like the students' union, N.C.C., N.S.S. etc. are formed for the students. The college has developed the philosophy of its obligation towards the society and arouses the students to meet it through above activities and through value-based education. The basic characters of North Lakhimpur College include the fact that it always looks forward with a vision and elements of innovation. That is why the college played a pioneering role in introducing vocational and professional courses like Electronics, Computer Application and Computer Science apart from many other career oriented courses. In fact, it was the first college in Assam to introduce the subject of Electronics in the undergraduate course.

The contribution of the college towards the development of human resources in the region is well appreciated by the society as well as by the U.G.C. and other organizations like DST, D.B.T, N.E.C., ABITA etc and was awarded "B⁺" grade by N.A.A.C.

- To upgrade all the existing laboratories by incorporating new technologies and instruments.
- To promote extension work to ensure social justice and to empower under-privileged sections.
- To make liaison with NGOs, GOs and SGOs for community development and disaster management.

Major Outcome of IQAC Activities

IQAC has been able to channelise the efforts and measures of the College towards academic excellence. The IQAC has established several cells and centers and constituted committees to initiate activities both academic and governance. Monthly meetings are conducted with the coordinator of IQAC as the chairman. Suggestions given by the members as well as well wishers are properly considered and the pros and cons of the implementation of the proposals are discussed. The Principal of the College in consultation with the IQAC has implemented various developmental plans and steps. The College has been able to establish IGNOU Study Centre and introduce some PG Diploma Courses with financial assistance from UGC and DBT. College-neighbourhood relationship has been further strengthened by conducting workshops, awareness programmes and special lectures on quality innovations. Some new academic centres like Human Rights, Gandhian Study Centre etc were established through funds from UGC during XI Plan. Computer centre has been redesigned with internet browsing terminals. Initiations have been made to automate the College Library and Office. Science laboratories have been updated by installing new equipments. Career Guidance Centre has also been has been restructured to enable students to identify and explore life choices and to empower them to attain their career goals through counseling, education, training, and support. Online counseling and registration for WASE programme was held on 19th December' 2008 in collaboration with Placement Cell of Dibrugarh University. Moreover, IQAC collects, maintains and analyses documents and prepares the Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) and submits it to NAAC. It also analyses the feedback received from the students, teachers and employees and inform the concerned authority about its outcome for further improvements.

Part-B

Criterion wise inputs for the year 2008-2009

1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution:

The primary aspiration of North Lakhimpur College is to always look forward with a vision and elements of innovation. The College is committed to raise standards of higher education in this part of North Eastern India and for us, offering high quality teaching is more than just a priority- it is our raison d'être. To be precise, we hope to devise a new equation for education in the near future: theory plus practical knowledge plus capacity to think. Over the course of the last six decades, the college has been able to establish its reputation as the best institute of higher education in a region of at least ten lakh people inhabiting across the north-eastern part of the state of Assam.

The activities of the College clearly reflect its core goals and objectives. North Lakhimpur College aims at providing quality education at the UG level with emphasis upon value orientation as education complemented by sound human values can only make a complete human being. The college has never distanced itself from the society and has always tried to maintain a cordial relationship with the people of the area as the institution is the result of collective efforts of the people of this part of Assam. The welfare and intellectual as well as ethical development of the students is the prime concern of the institution. They are provided with the best possible facilities so that they grow up with proper ethics. The college has developed the philosophy of its obligation towards the society and arouses the students to meet it through the following activities

1. Providing value orientation through NSS, NCC, forums, camps, special lectures, workshops.
2. Liaison with NGOs and GOs for community and national development.

3. Providing reservation to all the disadvantaged groups – SC, ST, OBC, differently abled groups as per Government Order in student enrolment, staff reservation at all levels
4. Providing quality education to students by offering relevant value based courses and programmes like Human Rights and Gandhian Thoughts
3. Establishing forums for community development and extension activities like Blood Donation camp, AIDS awareness camp, Flood relief camp, Plantation drive to create environmental awareness

Since its inception, the college has been able to produce generations after generations of people with clarity of vision and astute moral purposiveness. These educated people have been engaged in different fields of activity around the country fostering national unity and harmony to usher in a fertile atmosphere conducive to socio-economic growth. The college authority, with the assistance of IQAC has taken up a few steps and programmes as part of post accreditation measure in the college. The standard of teaching-learning process is improved by introducing technology-mediated measures such as introduction of audio visuals, microphones and uses of LCD in the classrooms. All the departments of the college have been provided with computer-related teaching equipments as and when needed. The classrooms have been equipped with high-power microphones to aid the teacher just in case they feel that they have to use them for proper teaching.

The college realizes the importance of inculcating the positive values of the society in the minds of its students. Extreme care is taken to rid the students of narrow communal and religious fanaticism. They are inspired to foster true scientific curiosity and thinking to counter the demonic influence of parochial vistas and superstitions that the dark side of the society often tries to impinge upon them. They are taught to get themselves purged off the anachronistic and dangerous social dogmas.

01. New academic programmes initiated:

North Lakhimpur College is affiliated to Dibrugarh University, Assam and is a provincialised institution under the Govt. of Assam. Its activities are subjected to be regulated by the norms and rules of the Dibrugarh University and the Govt. of Assam. The progress and programmes of the College, therefore, depend upon them. Two new Academic programmes have been initiated by the College viz. Career Oriented Courses in Computer Science, Herbal (Medicinal) Plantation and PG Diploma in Disaster Management. Distance learning courses conducted by IGNOU and K.K.Handique Open University have been introduced from the academic session 2008. The IGNOU Study Centre of the College set under the Convergence scheme offer a number of Post- Graduate, Graduate level, Diploma and Certificate courses. The Centre has been established with the intention of spreading quality higher education in the region. The Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University Study Centre at North Lakhimpur College has been imparting quality education ever since its establishment. The students who could not take advantage of the system of formal education for diverse reasons have enrolled themselves at the study centre for higher education. At present the study centre conduct classes for B.A, BMC, and BCA courses. Those students who could not clear matriculation can also aspire for higher studies by clearing BPP (Bachelor Preparatory Programme).

A new Post B.Sc diploma course in Plant Tissue Culture and Micro-propagation have been introduced from the session 2008, sponsored by department of Bio-technology.

02. Innovation in curricular design and Transaction:

The academic curriculum of North Lakhimpur College as well as other colleges of Dibrugarh University has been prepared by University itself and all colleges have implemented it from this (2008-2009) academic year.

03. Interdisciplinary programmes started:

- I. Department of Botany of North Lakhimpur College has been running a Post B.Sc. Diploma Course in Plant Tissue Culture & Micropropagation duly recommended by the Department of Biotechnology, Ministry of Science & Technology, Govt. of India, under the Human Resource Development Programme, for training

technologists in life Sciences and biotechnology. A student seeking admission to this course must have passed B.Sc. (Major) in Botany/Zoology/Microbiology/Biochemistry/Chemistry or any other related discipline with at least 45% marks in the main subject or B.Sc. (Gen.) with at least 45% marks in aggregate. A studentship of Rs 1200/- per month shall be paid to each student inducted for the course.

- II. As an innovative approach to professional development for emergency management, a P.G Diploma Course on “Disaster Management” under the Department of Geography has been introduced in the College. This programme focuses on training students in the scientific and social scientific aspects of the rapidly-evolving field of environmental hazards (natural and man-made) and their management. Graduates from any discipline can pursue the course.
- III. DOEACC (Departments of Electronics Accredited Computer Course) Center, Guwahati/ Tezpur has set up a training center at North Lakhimpur College and have created a computer laboratory cum class room in the college to train up 400 final year Under graduate/ Graduate students in two years under the DOEACC CISC training facility free of charges. DOEACC center, Guwahati, a unit of DOEACC society, an autonomous body of the Department of Information Technology, Ministry of Communication and Information Technology (MCIT) Govt. of India has conducted an IT Certificate Training Programme for the final year undergraduate and graduate level students with a Department of DONER sponsorship, in North Lakhimpur College. The main objective of the Certification of Information Science in the Colleges (CISC) Course is to make the final year graduate students more employable after completion of the course.

05. Examination reforms implemented:

The college follows the instructions formulated by Dibrugarh University at degree level. However, the institution arranges monthly Unit Test and two Terminal Test during specific time schedule to update the academic skills of the students. Further, every department of the college organizes seminar involving students of the major classes twice

in a month. Intimation to parents-guardians about the marks secured by students in University examinations, unit/sessional tests and attendance of students is also made.

06. Candidates qualified for NET/SLET/GATE etc.

As an under graduate college, no regular students can appear in the NET/SLET examination. However, a good number of pass out students have cleared such examinations. One teacher namely Hafez Ali Ahmed of Geography Department of this College has cleared NET-LS examination in 2008.

07. Initiative towards faculty development programme:

1. The college has taken a few initiative measures for the faculty development with financial assistance from UGC and other sources & through self-finance.

- (i) Computer (DOEACC) Training
- (ii) Encourages faculty members to participate in Refresher Courses, Orientation Programmes.
- (iii) Recommends the teacher to apply for MRP.
- (iv) The College has the provision of giving study leave to interested teachers to pursue research works leading to Ph.D or M.Phil. by adjusting their teaching schedule without hampering the normal academic atmosphere of the college. Many faculty members are doing research towards their Ph.D or M.Phil degree in Rajiv Gandhi University, Arunachal Pradesh; Gauhati University, Assam; Tezpur Central University, Assam, and also under Distance Education System of various Universities
- (v) Encourages attending Seminars, Workshops, and Conference etc.

- (vi) Organizes Seminar, Workshop, Training Programme etc to provide linkage with persons of national & international reputation so as to update the faculty members with recent trends & information & developing their skills by way of interaction & exchange of views.
- (vii) Encourage faculty members to express their views & noble thoughts by publishing articles & other writings.
- (viii) Involves teachers for all round development of the college.

11. New collaborative research programme:

A major portion of the teaching staff of North Lakhimpur College is actively involved in research. The college has long tradition of research work in various fields of studies. Research works have been regularly published in the form of articles and research papers. Apart from these Dr. A. Rajbongshi, Dr. S. N. Phukan, Dr. Rupa Phukan, Dr. Bhabajit Bhuyan and Sri Diganta Hatibaruah have been doing minor research projects with the financial assistance from UGC under 10th Plan.

Although the college has not signed any MOU yet, as a part of Faculty Improvement Programme the teachers of various departments have linkages with reputed institutions through their research activities. Dr. Sailendra Nath Phukan of the Department of Botany is a recognized supervisor of IGNOU. Dr. (Mrs.) Namita Dutta Boruah of Political Science Department is also guiding research scholars under DDE, Madurai Kamraj University. Dr. Bhabajit Bhuyan of Department of Chemistry is guiding a research scholar under Vinayak Mission University, Tamil Nadu through Distance Education System. He has also carried out research works in Environmental Soil and Water Chemistry in collaboration with Dr. H. P. Sarma, Head Department of Environmental Science and Prof. A. K. Mishra, Department of Chemistry, Gauhati University. Dr. Binita Bhagawati, Department of Education, Dr. Debajit Boruah, Department of Anthropology, Dr. Biman Chetia, Department of Mathematics are also guiding M.Phil students under Distance Education System of various Universities.

Bori, Sri Binda Sah, Sri Arabinda Rajkhowa, Sri Diganta Hatiboruah, Sri Rupam Gogoi are also doing research work. Moreover, many students are guided by the faculty members towards their M.Phil. Degree under various Universities.

25. Computerization of administration and the process of admission and examination results:

Proper initiations have been made to fully automate the College Office. Till now, the Admission Process and Cash receipts have been completely computerized. A part of Examination works like marks entry, seat plan, invigilation duty list etc. have also been computerized. New University Registration are made through specific computer software supplied by the University. Students database is carefully maintained. University

Examination results are hosted in the website. Marks entry in Examination Zone of N. L. College is entered through software supplied by the University. The process of administration is transparent and computerized in the year 2006.

26. Increase in the infrastructural facilities:

To keep pace with the increasing number of students and to furnish them with the minimum norms and facilities as well as to accommodate them, the college is trying to develop and increase its infrastructural facility, with internal as well as external resources.

- Installation of fully equipped multi-gym at the College campus with the financial assistance from Ministry of Sports, GOI.
- Construction of New Zoology Building with financial assistance from The Tea Board, Assam.
- Construction of a new drinking water plant with the financial assistance of Rs. 80,000/- (Eighty thousand) donated by Mrs. Kalpana Borgohain in the memory of her late son is completed.
- New Arts' building is completed. Department of Assamese, Economics, English & DOEACC are shifted to that building.
- Girls' common room is expanded and it is fully accommodated with chairs, tables and sports items etc.
- Renovation of Teachers Common room is completed.
- Playground is renovated.
- Chemistry laboratory building is renovated.

27. Technology up gradation:

- Use of Information Technology in enhancement of quality such as use of internet and Eduset.
- The North Lakhimpur College Students' Election Process is fully computerized by developing a new software. The software has been developed by Mr. Ranjit Paul, HOD, Computer Science.
- Establishment of Computer Centre with 30 internet browsing terminals.

28. Computer and Internet access and training to teachers and students:

To further the usages of information technology among students, the College has established one state of the art Computer and Networking Centre with 30 internet browsing terminals, installed VPN for education in addition to the existing EDUSAT besides encouraging the use of ICT tools in the teaching learning process. Students of the college are provided with free internet facility and free access to EDUSAT.

DOEACC Center, Guwahati/Tezpur has set up a training center at North Lakhimpur College and has created a computer lab cum classroom in the college to train up 400 final year Under Graduate/ Graduate students in two years under the DOEACC CISC training facility free of charges.

29. Financial aid to Students:

Financial aids to students are provided by the central and state governments in the form of National Scholarship, State Merit Scholarship, Scholarships to SC/ST /OBC/MOBC students.

- (i) Govt. Scholarships
 - a) National Scholarship (on all India basis)
 - b) State Merit Scholarship (on all Assam basis)
 - c) Scholarship to the students of Scheduled Cast and Scheduled tribes.
 - d) Scholarship to the students of Other Backward Caste and More Other Backward Caste.

Apart from the scholarships received by the students from central and state government as per the rule, the institution itself offers various scholarships and awards to recognize meritorious achievements of the students in different fields. The College also maintains a 'Student Aid Fund'.

- (ii) Scholarship offered by the College – The following scholarships and certificate are awarded to the students by the college –
 - a) Cash prize of Rs. 200/- to the students of this college having 90% and above attendance in academic year (July to May).
 - b) Cash prize of Rs. 3,000/- to the Degree students with Anthropology (Major) securing highest marks in final examination for in the memory of Dilip Phukan, Lecturer, Department of Anthropology, North Lakhimpur College.

c) Freeships to educationally brilliant and economically backward students.

(iii) Student Aid Fund maintained by the College – On application to the Principal an amount up to a maximum of Rs. 500 (lump sum) is granted to the poor and meritorious students whose father's/guardian's annual income does not exceed Rs. 5000 to enable such students to purchase books etc.

30. Activities and support from the Alumni Association:

The alumni contribute generously to the development of the college. The Association takes up different positive and quality oriented measure from time to time and renders active cooperation to the college management towards implementing various programmes. A large number of members of the association generously provide financial aid to the authority as and when situation demands, which are utilized in the development of various infrastructure and other facilities. The main objectives of the association is to keep in close touch with the college and to organize seminars, talks, symposia, conferences, cultural and other programme in the college, from time to time, in order to inspire and educate the current batches of students and exchange views and ideas. They also provide the feed back to the college to reshape the present teaching and learning programmes to suit the new job requirements.

31. Activities and Supports from the parents- teachers association:

The parents/ guardians have a major role in enhancing the academic environment of the college. The association has been very active in dealing with matters related to the academic well being of the college family. At present the association has about 500 members with Mr. Sarat Ch. Challeng as President and Mr Golap Hazarika as Secretary.

32. Health Services:

The health services in North Lakhimpur Colleges take utmost care towards the maintenance of health and hygiene of the college. The health care center of the college is run by few faculty members and students. The unit arranges “Aqua Guard drinking water”

facility for the students and staff. Various programmes and activities like yoga, physiotherapy are arranged of them with active cooperation of the doctors.

33. Performance in Sports activities:

Games and sports are integral part of education and it influences the physical and mental development of the students. The college has provided a massive playground within the campus to facilitate students for outdoor games and athletics. Minor games facilities like table tennis, badminton, carom, and chess are also available for the students. The college has a well equipped gymnasium club.

The games and sports scenario of the college has been quite encouraging during the past one year. Our College Cricket team done commendably well in the Inter College Cricket tournament for the Session 2008-09 held at Dibrugarh University. The football team has also performed commendably in inter College football Tournament. In Inter College Badminton Championship, held in Nov.2008 girls team of our college emerged as the 2nd Best Team. Further, in the Youth Festival of Dibrugarh University 2009 held at Sibsagar. College our students showed brilliant results and brought following laurels for the institution. Best actor in Drama (Sri.Mrinal Kashyap), 1st position in Tabla (Sri. Ruten Hazarika), 3rd position in Rabha Sangit (Sri.Akhyaya Gogoi),2nd Best Team in Drama and 3rd Best Team in Chorus Smti.Jeuti Sharma of North Lakhimpur College was selected to represent D.U. Badminton Girls Team in inter University Badminton Competition. Sri.Bikram Chetri was selected to represent Assam Ranji Trophy Team and Assam under 19 team. Sri. Mridul Dutta and Sri.Jugananda Bhuyan selected for Assam state team.

34. Incentives to out standing sports persons:

The college has awarded Rs.1000 to each player of the victorious cricket team for their performance in the Inter College Cricket Tournament. Further, the local MLA has presented a track suit to each player. The College has also provision to offer Medals, Cash Prize, exemption of monthly dues and TA/DA for students participated in various Sports events like Inter College, Inter University, National level etc.

35. Students achievement and awards:

North Lakhimpur College has been able to prove its quality level of academic potentiality by the brilliant results of the students in various levels of examinations. The quality of students can easily be assessed from the brilliant results of the final examination conducted by Dibrugarh University and Assam Higher Secondary Education Council. As many as 31 students in the science stream secured 1st class in various major subjects and 17 students in the arts stream in the TDC Part III exam 2009. Moreover Miss .Dharitri Borgohain of the Department of Botany was adjudged the 'Best Graduate' in Science stream from Dibrugarh University for the session 2008—2009. Further, during the same session the following students of North Lakhimpur College secured 1st class 1st position in the TDC Part III examination of Dibrugarh University *Dharitri Borgohain (Botany) *Nabajyoti Sangmai (Mathematics) *Brojen Sarmah (Assamese) *Mandira Buragohain (Anthropology). add to the existing glory of the institution.

Miss Dharitri Borgohain, having major (honors) in Botany was adjudged the Best Graduate of Dibrugarh University in the year 2009.

36. Activities of the Guidance & Counseling Unit:

The mission of the Career and Counseling Cell is to enable students to identify and explore life choices and to empower them to attain their career goals through counseling, education, training, and support. The Career and Counseling Cell is a student service of North Lakhimpur College. Since its founding in 2004 as a non profit Centre under the aegis of the College, the Center has provided services that meet the career development and educational needs of students of North Lakhimpur College. It carried out the following two programmes in addition to periodic career guidance seminars.

- Online placement interview of 95 students for the Pilot Project of NASSCOM-DONER-NAC on December, 2007.
- Online counseling and registration for WASE programme on 19th December' 2008 in collaboration with Placement Cell, Dibrugarh University.

It is hoped that with initiatives from IQAC, the Cell will be completely restructured in the next year for the benefit of the students.

37. Placement services provided to students:

There is no employment cell and placement officer. However, the IQAC has established links with the Placement Cell of the affiliating University to promote students for campus placement. Following this, an online counseling and registration for WASE programme on 19th December' 2008 in collaboration with Placement Cell, Dibrugarh University was held and expected that some of the students applied will be placed. The IQAC has also applied for a full fledged Career Counselling Cell to UGC during XI Plan. With the establishment of the Cell, Campus recruitment can be done at the College itself.

38. Development programmes for non- teaching staff:

The college provides computer-training facility to the non-teaching staff through the computer-training scheme introduced at the college. The college has provided financial assistance to non- teaching staff to learn Tally and other office softwares.

- Ensuring good students support – academic, infrastructure, finance and co-curricular activities.
- Good results and significant progression to higher education.

- Computer Centre having 30 terminals with internet facilities.
- Purchasing of modern instruments and teaching aids.
- Construction of new Arts and Zoology building.
- Good indoor and outdoor sports facilities, grounds, materials, gymnasium.
- Adequate Hostel facilities.
- A new Plant tissue culture and Disaster Management Laboratory were established.

40. Linkages development with National/ International, academic/ research bodies:

The College offers various UG courses under KKHSOU, IDOL, G. U and Distance Education, D.U by establishing Study Centre for the benefit of its ex students as well as drop out, employed, economically poor and overaged students.

Over the years North Lakhimpur College has been able to collaborate with some of the institution of national repute for all round academic development of its students. The College hosted a “Workshop on Disaster Management” in collaboration with the Disaster Management Cell of Tezpur Central University on 2009. Another National Seminar cum workshop was also organized at the College in collaboration with ACTA Zonal Committee and NERIWALM, a central research organization on 2008. Besides these, a workshop in collaboration with UNDP was held on 2009 specially to aware students about the human rights. Moreover, the students pursuing the DBT sponsored Post B.Sc. Diploma Course in Tissue Culture and Micropropagation were also trained in NIST (CSIR), Jorhat. The College also offers various courses under IGNOU (ODL) as its partner institute. Positive talks are going on with some industrial unit like Nagaon Paper Mill, Jagiroad for creating employability of students pursuing the DBT sponsored Post B.Sc. Diploma Course in Tissue Culture and Micropropagation.

One of the basic characteristics of North Lakhimpur College is to involve local bodies and community in its various activities. The College works hand in hand with some local NGO’s like Green Heritage and community centre like Swami Vivekananda Kendra for environmental and socio cultural awareness programmes.

Part-C
